



Admissions Protocol for Introduction to Counselling Courses

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Protocol for the admission of candidates for the Introduction to Counselling course at Spurgeon's College

1. This protocol document provides guidance for admission to the Introduction to Counselling course delivered at Spurgeon's College.
2. Admissions to the Introduction to Counselling course are the responsibility of Counselling Department in conjunction with the Admissions Department.
3. There are no qualifications required to be admitted onto this course.
4. The College will not admit anyone under the age of 18 on to the Introduction to Counselling course.
5. Where the course is taught in person, applicants need to supply evidence that they are lawfully in the United Kingdom and entitled to study here. However, where the course is being offered via remote learning platforms then international students may apply.
6. To be able to engage effectively with the course, applicants should have a good understanding of the English Language, including the ability to read and write to a reasonable standard. Applicants may be required to demonstrate that they meet English language requirements prior to admission.
7. Student visas are not available for the Introduction to Counselling Course.
8. Applicants are strongly encouraged to disclose any disabilities, health issues whether physical or mental, or learning difficulties which might impact their studies. The College will make all reasonable adjustments for such students, but where there are concerns about a student's ability to undertake their desired course, the procedures in the College's Fitness to Study policy are followed.
